ANIMALS IN VENICE SHORES

WHEN YOUR WONDERFUL DOG FINDS TIME TO TAKE YOU OUT FOR A WALK!!

Please insist that, in accord with the Harrison Township Ordinances, your dog stays connected to you via his/her leash. This is for your dog's safety and that of your neighbors. We love to see you and your pets using our streets for some exercise. Many residents on your journey enjoy sharing a bit of time with your pet. However, most residents would appreciate it if you would leave your address with any deposits your pet leaves behind so they can return it to your doorstep!

OUR FINE FEATHERED FRIENDS ON THE CANALS

Please do not feed the ducks and geese as this causes them to congregate in our canals which, in turn, raise the e-coli levels in the water. Some residents swim in the canals and most of us use canal water to sprinkle our lawns and gardens. VSPOA conducts a water test annually to monitor and report these pollution levels. By not attracting excess numbers of these birds, we can help keep our water cleaner.

RECENT BOARD INITIATIVES

UPDATING OF CLAIRPOINTE AND BAYHAVEN ENTRANCES

The board allocated funding to update the entrances at both Bayhaven and Clairpoint. They will have a new look from trees to landscaping to new signs. As the weather breaks look for the changes.

GENERAL PUBLIC USE OF ROAD CROSSOVERS FOR PARKING AND CANAL ACCESS

Macomb County Department of Roads has eliminated parking at the canal/road crossovers. Signs are posted as such. Hopefully this will eliminate the hazard of parked cars narrowing our roads at these locations. An added benefit should be less strangers wandering in our subdivision.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP THIS YEAR?

DRAINAGE OF WATER FROM THE ROADS

When board members drive around the subdivision after rainstorms, they notice that road damage occurs where water is not properly drained from the road. This is NOT a coincidence. In nearly all such situations, proper drainage of the road has been blocked by the landscaping (grass) on the adjoining lots. Often some small adjustments to the sod elevation between drains and the road is all you need to do to correct this problem. If you have any questions about what actions you can take to alleviate this problem, contact any board member.

DO NOT OVEKWATER YOUR LAWN

Many owners seem to water their lawns much more than is necessary. Most healthy lawns will do very well with 20 minutes of water per zone three times per week even in very dry times. Excess watering just causes more nutrients (fertilizer you paid for) to go into the canals and exacerbate the weed problems in our canals. Also, when excess sprinkling water stands on the streets, it just adds to the deterioration of our road surfaces.

GET ACTIVE!

Come out to a Venice Shores Homeowners Association meeting or event. Meeting some of your neighbors from another street can enhance your enjoyment of life in Venice Shores. Another fun thing to do is to become the chairperson for one of our events. Sure – it can be work, but two or more people splitting the task often makes the job more fun.
